- The study showed that using high doses of powerful drugs to (21) <u>slash</u> levels of "bad cholesterol" far below current targets can (22) <u>markedly</u> reduce patients' risks. The federal government's National Cholesterol Education Program said in July that those at high risk could consider pushing their levels lower.
